Toward a Narratology of the Graphic

In an attempt to bring the language of graphic narrative more into the fold of narratological enquiry, this lecture will look at the non-verbal code, grammar, and syntax of the graphic novel as it plays out in a selection of works by Art Spiegelman, Frank Miller, and Chris Ware. Through an analysis of the graphic works of these authors this lecture will trace the contours of contemporary graphic language and suggest a means of fully integrating graphic works into the realm of narratology.
